his was the start of an enormous project that has been well supported by a number of members of the club and the wider community. We are very grateful to the Yorke Peninsula Council for a grant which allowed us to employ Jeff Rawlings and Son to install the seating (along with help from several members) and Adrian and Annie Brokenshire who steam cleaned all the seats prior to installation. Thanks also to the Eglinton's who allowed us to store the seats in their premises next door to the theatre and the Maitland Progress Association who organised the aisle signage. My personal thanks to Fermby who helped above and beyond, Graham and Dylan who sanded the floors into the night and the many others who transported, stacked, installed, removed and otherwise helped with the project. It is now complete and we hope you enjoy the new comfortable seats.




t the same time as we were installing seating we were planning for our

I wish the cast, musicians and crew a big 'chookas' for Chitty and thank you our wonderful audience for your continued patronage.


DÍRECTOR'S WELGOME

Bang is quite simply the biggest and most complex production that Maitland Music and Arts club has ever attempted. It has been an all-consuming task over the last 3 months

of rehearsals and for several months prior. Not only is Miss Chitty the most



expensive prop that we have ever put on the McKnight theatre stage but the sheer volume of other props required to stage this production is quite staggering (and has literally filled up our backstage holding area). We are very fortunate that the MMAC Performing Arts School successfully obtained a grant from the Yorke Peninsula Council to put towards the purchase of a projector and that we are able to use it for this production. While this has certainly negated the need for scenic artists and canvas backdrops, we exchanged that for a whole new set of challenges for this production, such as making Chitty 'drive.' I know that there was at least a little hesitation when I first announced that we would employ a 'steampunk' design theme in this show. Chitty Chitty Bang Bang is a fantasy story, not a historical drama so I felt that we could introduce a more fantasmagorical design element into some of the costuming and

for parts of the set. I certainly didn't want our Miss Chitty to be a 'standard run-of-the-mill' Chitty car and she has come up a treat from her 'facelift' and we all love her very much.

hile I would like to thank all my performers for their hard work and dedication over the last 12 weeks and I must make special mention of my leads Dylan and Jess, both of whom have risen spectacularly to the challenge of their respective roles. There are also two other groups within the cast that require a special mention. Firstly thank you to the 'Inventors' who all came out of theatrical retirement to join us. I have performed with (and in some cases directed) these wonderful young men at various times over the last 35 years that I have been involved with MMAC and it has been great fun and a privilege to work with them all again.

he second group of performers that need a special mention are the junior cast. While small in number they have been mighty in their patience, persistence and professionalism. It is no mean feat to work alongside a cast full of adults and I am very proud of their progress as performers. Every single one of them has grown in confidence and skill and it will be wonderful to see what they achieve in the years to come. In particular I must commend Indy and Hugo (Jemima and Jeremy Potts). These two have been indefatigable and determined in their efforts, learning lines, dance routines and singing like little angels throughout the rehearsal process. They are simply the two best juvenile lead performers that I have ever worked with.

MMAC is blessed with a wonderful 'can-do' attitude and I am humbled by the efforts of the many, many people who have had an input into Chitty. 


The Maitland Music & Arts Club
